Please use this comprehensive 2016 Annual Report to learn more about our regional airline industry. Passenger enplanements for 2015 totaled 156.56 million, down slightly compared to 157.56 million in 2014. Regional airlines served 615 airports in 2015 with 417 U.S. airports (64.6%) relying exclusively on regional airline service for their community's only scheduled service. 2015 Year at a Glance Shows Impact of Growing Pilot Shortage

Regional airlines keep every corner of North America connected to the global air transportation network. Without regional airlines, fully 2/3 of our nation's airports, currently served exclusively by regional airlines, would lose connectivity and the economic driver that safe and reliable air service brings to local communities.

Today, despite heavy investment in its pilot workforce, the regional airline industry sits on the front lines of a growing pilot shortage. Without intervention, the number of pilots entering the profession will not keep pace with the unprecedented number of mandatory retirements over the next decade. At the same time, major airlines will hire additional pilots to keep pace with other attrition and growth. Once characterized as a regional airline problem, the

pilot shortage will continue to have a much broader impact. Major airlines frequently hire from regional airlines, yet a forecast by the University of North Dakota* predicts major airlines will need to hire 18,643 pilots by the year 2020, a number equivalent to today's entire regional airline pilot workforce. Within a decade, demand is forecast at 48,354 pilots — that's nearly triple today's regional airline pilot workforce. While major airlines have historically tapped military pilots to fill their classrooms, that pipeline is also shrinking, with the armed forces facing its own shortage. In fact, the cumulative shortfall of pilots is forecast to exceed 14,000 by 2026, which could necessitate parking as many as 1,400 aircraft.

The operational impact of the pilot shortage is already here, and you will see it reflected in these pages. Regional airline enplanements and operations were down last year. The regional industry had fewer seats available but, with load factors at an all-time high, more of those seats were full. Regional airlines'

average stage length has also been increasing, reflecting use of larger aircraft with longer range as the pilot shortage continues to prompt or accelerate up gauging. Unfortunately, not every community has the economics to sustain air service with larger equipment. Hundreds of airports have lost frequency and dozens of communities have lost all air service. This is not simple economics — many profitable and otherwise sustainable routes have been cut due to insufficient pilot workforce.

Fortunately, real solutions to the pilot shortage are within reach. Regional airlines have already taken action and have aggressively invested in their current and future pilots to help boost the attractiveness of the profession. This step alone won't resolve the crisis, however; broader solutions are needed to address the high barriers to entry confronting aspiring pilots. Ultimately, Federal regulators must ensure hiring standards for entry level pilots are evidence-based and truly support a highly-proficient hiring pool. To this end, regulators have already approved structured, alternate pathways to a pilot's Air Transport Pilot (ATP) certificate, which are well supported by data and viewed as safe routes to the commercial flight deck. These alternate pathways should be supported, continued, and expanded. Lawmakers should further support aspiring pilots by ensuring flexible student loan coverage for

flight training. Solutions that invest in the safe and seamless career path of a professional pilot will help restore the quality of the available pilot hiring pool today while attracting more young people to the profession tomorrow.

Next, RAA continues to fend off shortsighted initiatives seeking to reform ATC but failing to account for the unique and distinct role regional airlines play in the airspace. Regional airlines operate 44 percent of U.S. flights, and some proposals to reform the nation's Air Traffic Control could increase costs for regional airline segments, putting these flights and small community air service at risk. Equally problematic, recent proposals have excluded the voice of regional airlines from the envisioned ATC governance board. Regional airlines are distinct operators and alone can pursue the certainty that the industry's

health and unique role will be respected when it comes to control and pricing of the airspace.

While pilot workforce has presented the industry with its largest challenge, regional airlines have been working hard to support and attract the next generation of other professionals, including maintenance technicians. Outreach to the industry's future workforce must begin early and introduce aviation to young people who might otherwise never consider an airline career. In order to help connect aviation professionals in all career paths with opportunities at regional airlines, we are excited to host the first ever RAA Career Expo and Forum, planned for our 2017 annual convention in Palm Beach.

Before closing, a word on our data: the regional airline industry is ever-evolving and the RAA's analytical approach is in lockstep. Last year we tightened our definition of a

regional airline to include those U.S. certificate holders providing scheduled passenger service under 14 CFR Parts 135 or 121 with aircraft capacities of fewer than 100 seats. This year's further refined approach has excluded Part 380 public charter operations from our dataset, lending greater clarity to the definition of a regional airline.

We hope you find this annual report enriching and learn more about the industry as you read. As we face these challenges, the resolve of this community — airlines, employee partners, supply company partners, customers, and all of us at the RAA — is steady and strong. With safety-first solutions in range, we will fulfill our vital role keeping North America connected for years to come.







Average Passenger Trip Length (miles)







Revenue Passenger Miles





U.S. Regional Airline Total 2015 Passenger Enplanements


2015 Regional Airline Enplanements








Comparative Trends in U.S. Passenger Airline Service

The following section includes both industry and regional airline specific departure statistics at the nation's Top 50 U.S. airports (both in chart and map form), as well as a map showing those U.S. airports served exclusively by regional airlines.

On page 33, an additional section begins with a state-by-state analysis, including Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico, of a number of key statistics. These include: 1) total number of passengers enplaned in that particular state; 2) total number of annual airline departures and 3) percentage of regional flights \rightarrow for each scheduled service airport in the state; 4) percentage of enplanements \dagger for each airport. This year's *Annual Report* also includes 5) Essential Air Service compensation numbers, based on an August 1, 2016 report from DOT, listed by carrier and community for those states included in this government funded program.



^{*}The Essential Air Service (EAS) program was put into place to guarantee that small communities that were served by certificated air carriers before airline deregulation maintain a minimal level of scheduled air service. The United States Department of Transportation is mandated to provide eligible EAS communities with access to the National Air Transportation System. This is generally accomplished by subsidizing two round trips a day with 30-to 50-seat aircraft, or additional frequencies with aircraft with 9-seat or fewer, usually to a large- or medium-hub airport. The Department currently subsidizes commuter and certificated air carriers to serve approximately 60 communities in Alaska and 115 communities in the lower 48 contiguous states that otherwise would not receive any scheduled air service.





There is also a degree completion program offered online through the Division of Continuing Studies and a minor in aviation that can complement any major at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. At the graduate level, a student can obtain a Master of Public Administration with a concentration in Aviation Administration. This graduate degree can be completed online or on

campus. The Aviation Institute is located in the College of Public Affairs and Community Service building on the campus of the University of Nebraska at Omaha. The flight simulators, classrooms and main offices are located on campus. The flight training is done at one of our local FBOs in the Omaha Metro Area.
